## The ZCMB - A Brief History

anesville flourished with performing arts activities in the late 1800s, and the John Bauer Band was among them. The band was organized before 1880 and averaged 15 to 20 members. When the band leader died in 1912, his ensemble was taken over by the American Rolling Mills Company, and became known as the Armco Band.

The 7th Regiment and Armco bands held their concerts locally, in McIntire Park and Putnam Park. By 1923, the two bands had merged, taking the present day name of Zanesville Memorial Concert Band.

Today, funds for the concerts are raised by individual and corporate contributions. An endowment fund has also been established for anyone wishing to make a donation towards the ZMCB.

The band's current home is Zane's Landing Park, along the eastern banks of the Muskingum River in downtown Zanesville. Concerts are performed on five Sunday evenings through the summer.

Concerts remain free to the public, thanks to the generosity of our supporters.

## **PROGRAM NOTES**

#### **Procession of the Nobles**

#### by Nicholai Rimsky-Korsakov arr. by Eric Leidzen

Rimsky-Korsakov (1844-1908) was one of the five Russian composers dubbed "The Mighty Handful" by Russian music critic Vladimir Stasov in 1867. Among his many composition are 15 operas. Procession of the Nobles was written as a part of his opera Mlada in 1889. Eric Leidzen orchestrated this piece for the Edwin Franko Goldman band in 1938.

#### Variations on a Korean Folksong

#### by John Barnes Chance

While serving in the Eighth U.S. Army Band in 1958-59 in Seoul South Korea J. B. Chance heard the folk song entitled Arrirang (pronounced "Ah-dee-dong"). He said "The tune is not as simple as it sounds, and my fascination with it during the intervening years led to the eventual use as the theme for this set of variations." This piece was composed in 1965 and won the prestigious Ostwald award presented by the American Bandmasters Association in 1966.

#### Swamp Rabbit Stomp

#### by Michael Sweeney

Michael Sweeney is the Director of Band Publications for the Hal Leonard Corporation and has had over 500 compositions and arrangements published. He was commissioned by the South Carolina Band Directors Association to compose this piece and it was premiered by their AllState Junior Band in 2015. The swamp rabbit is a large, furry cottontail found in the swamps and wetlands of the southern U.S.

#### <u>The Sound of Music by Rodgers & Hammerstein</u> arr. by Robert Russell Bennett

The team of Richard Rodgers (composer), Oscar Hammerstein II (lyricist) and Robert Russell Bennett(orchestrator) was responsible for five of the most successful shows in the history of Broadway. The Sound of Music was the team's final show before the death of Oscar Hammerstein in 1960. The songs in this arrangement are; "The Sound of Music", "How Can Love Survive", "Lonely Goatherd" "My Favorite Things", "Sixteen Going on Seventeen", "So Long Farewell", "Edelweiss", "Do, Re Mi", "How Do You Solve a Problem Like Maria" and "Climb Every Mountain".

## **PROGRAM NOTES**

#### ...Not Afraid to Dream by Brian Balmages

This composition was commissioned by John Marshall High School in Rochester Minnesota in 2006 on the passing of one its students Kevin Langlie who was a member of the class of 2006 and played tuba in the band. One of the hymns sung at Kevin's wake "Lift High the Cross" was the musical basis of the composition. A short tuba duet toward the end of the piece reminds everyone that Kevin is still in the band. The title of the piece comes from the eulogy delivered by his band director at his funeral "His focus on the positive and possible left no room in his life for negative attitudes and excuses...He wasn't afraid to dream and share those dreams..."

#### <u>Lennon / McCartney Portrait</u> arr. by Bill Holcombe

John Lennon and Paul McCartney were the creative force behind much of the British rock group "The Beatles" success in the 60s and 70s. Arranger Bill Holcombe has put together four of their most popular songs; "Hard Day's Night" (1964), "And I Love Her" (1964), "Day Tripper" (1965) and "Hey Jude" (1968).

#### <u>The Stars and Stripes Forever</u> by John Philip Sousa

Sousa wrote in his autobiography, that he composed this march in his head on Christmas Day in 1896. He was on an ocean liner returning to the United States, having just learned of the death of his longtime manager, David Blakely. He committed it to paper when he reached shore. It was first performed in May of 1897 and was immediately greeted with enthusiasm. Sousa also wrote a set of lyrics, which led to a 1942 four part choral version of the march. This is the National March of the United States of America, by a 1987 act of the U.S. Congress and signed into law by President Ronald Reagan.

#### JANINE SCHMELZER BOCK ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

M rs. Schmelzer Bock, a native of Bremen, Ohio, received her Bachelor of Music Education and Master of the Arts degrees from the Ohio State University. As a member of the Ohio State University Marching Band, she became the first woman to dot the "i" in the famed "Script Ohio" marching maneuver in a single-script at a home football game. Schmelzer Bock was also a member of the 122nd Army Band / Army National Guard, stationed at Beitler Armory in Worthington where she achieved the rank of Specialist 4th Class.

As a public school teacher, she was the assistant band director at Philo HS then became the Director of Bands at Licking Valley High School where she directed the Marching Band, revived the Jazz Workshop Ensemble, and directed the Concert Band to OMEA State Adjudications for the first time in the school's history. She currently is an active adjudicator for OMEA (Ohio Music Education Association) and conducts the Middle School Band at St. Benedict Catholic School. When not wielding the baton in front of the ZMCB, you will find her playing

tuba for the band.

#### Kelley Ryan Assistant director

r. Ryan received a Bachelor of Music Degree from Muskingum College in 1975 and a Mater of Music Degree from the University of Akron in 1980. He has also studied at The University of Virginia, Kent State University, Ohio University, Andrews University and Ashland University. He has been an OMEA Adjudicator since 1981 and served at the OMEA District 9 /treasurer for four years. More recently, he edited and revised the OMEA Required Solo lists for soprano, tenor and bariton saxophones and for the Eb clarinet.

In August, Mr. Ryan will begin his 42 year directing bands for the Zanesville City School System where he teaches grades 5 through 12.
