Mr. Treier is a graduate of The Ohio State University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education. He retired as the director of bands at Cambridge City Schools after serving for 29 years. He was named Outstanding Music Educator in 1993 by the Ohio Music Educators Association. Max has been a member of the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band for 22 years and served as the announcer for a number of years. This is his sixth year as Artistic Director.

Program notes on “**The Lake**” by Dr. Schlacks. Edited by Fred Smith

The Lake is a six-movement, mostly tonal, programmatic work (today we will play the fourth and sixth movements) about the visual sensations that arise by looking at a large lake sited in a state park. Composed in the fall of 2004, the fourth movement (binary) portrays rather dilapidated cabin near the water's edge, using a rather sterile chord succession. However, as the viewer thinks beyond the decrepit external appearance, and begins to imagine the cabin in better days, the music turns to that of romance with thoughts of the cozy interior whose fireplace casts a wonderful glow upon the young couple who are so fortunate as to live on the shore of this beautiful lake. The sixth movement has our lake watcher reluctantly packing up to return to the work-a-day world. But before leaving, takes one last look at the lake and marvels at how the majesty, the mystery, and the pure joy that this day and this lake has graced his life. To the state of Ohio, I say thank you for preserving this beauty known as Salt Fork Lake and the forests surrounding it for all of us to take time to slow down and reflect on the glorious beauty of nature.

Charles Savage Biography

Charles Savage, a graduate of **Ohio Valley College** ((78), **Harding** (82), with a B. A. in Music Education. In 1986, he graduated from **Ohio University** with a M. M. in Music Ed., and in 1988 with a M. M. in Music Theory and Composition. He has taught music at Ohio University- Zanesville in 1998, and began conducting the **Ouz Choral Union** in 2000. His other duties include teaching music theory, history, and class voice. As a singer, he has performed with the Zanesville Memorial Band, Zanesville Community Theatre, the Civic Chorus, and some of the areas churches. He has given voice recitals at Muskingum College and has been active as a church musician for more than 30 years. As a composer, he has written compositions, in various forms, including incidental music for several theatrical productions at the **Zanesville Community Theatre**. Some of his compositions have been performed nationally. His **Time Works** were featured at the Eye of the Elk/ Ohio Bicentennial Art Show in Zanesville, His Clarinet/ Saxophone duet, **Mad Rush to the End**, was performed at the **SOC District 6** Conference in January, 2004, as well as other performances, and is featured on the internet. He is a member of **ASCAP**, **OMEA/MENC**, **ZAAP**, and a lifetime member of **Society of Composer, Inc.**

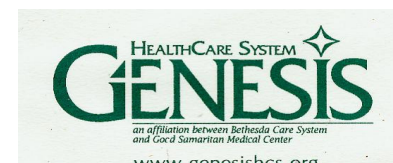

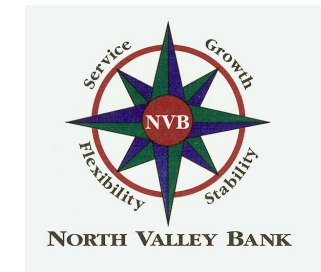
